COMMUNITY LINKS AND SPORT

Kerl came and led our Harvest service.

Kate Owen from Bassaleg School worked with Y6 developing their reasoning skills.

Nursery children put on a "fine dining" experience for their parents in Beanies café.; Y5 Parents were invited in for a meeting with the Llangrannog residential center; Y1 pupils invited their parents into school for a hot chocolate and a the story of Bear's Magic Pencil; Y3HB invited their parents in to share their work on China; Y2 held a craft afternoon. During Science week, the PTA funded a "Mad Science" roadshow to visit the school and provide workshops for every year group. The week ended with the parents being invited into every class to see the work the children had done.

The OAPs of Rogerstone were invited to afternoon tea in Beanies Café. The school hosted a Rogerstone Ward meeting where local parking was on the agenda.

The year ended with the Y6 Oscars evening, followed by a BBQ and disco courtesy of the PTA and the whole community came together to celebrate Culture and Diversity at Roggie-Fest 2

Many of our families came to support our children taking part in their sports days. The rugby team took part in 4 tournaments, winning 2 of them and coming runners up in 1! The netball Team played and beat Marshfield. The football team played Mount Pleasant. Janice worked with Y3, teaching and developing their rugby skills and in the summer term we started a whole school Friday morning run.

Parents' evenings were once again extremely well attended.

The Leadership Team led an open evening for parents and provided a literacy and numeracy workshop. This event wasn't very well attended – 13 people.

The school choir sang at the LloydsTSB Children in Need call center and at St John's Church Rogerstone for their Christmas carol service and took part in the 1000 Voice Choir event in Cardiff.

Reception children led a beautiful Christmas carol concert in St Woolos Cathedral. Reception classes held a Christmas fayre as part of their skills topic. Y2 took to the stage for their Christmas concert – It's Strictly Nativity and both morning and afternoon Nursery performed their Nativity

The PTA were once again very busy organising a spooky disco, Christmas Craft fayre, Film Nights, Christingle Photography, Valentines disco, summer disco, coffee mornings, Santa's Grotto and a wonderful Christmas Fayre during the holidays.

Our musicians performed for family and friends, showcasing their talents

PC Thomas worked with various classes. The fire brigade worked with Y2 and Y5 classes. The Traffic Police visited the Nursery in their Police Car. WELSH LANGUAGE

All children in the school are taught Welsh as a Second Language by their class teachers and used incidentally where appropriate, in other subjects in the curriculum. All adults in the school model Welsh incidentally throughout the course of the school day. The teaching of Welsh as a Second Language is described in our policy and scheme of work. No children in the school speak Welsh at home. Transition work with our partner secondary schools ensures the continuity of instruction in Welsh for pupils.

World book day saw the whole school dress up as a character from a book. Y6 took it one step further and all dressed up as Where's Wally ... without telling their teachers!

CURRICULUM ORGANISATION

The staff and governors at Rogerstone Primary School recognise that additional learning needs (ALN) is a whole school issue and that all teachers are teachers of children with SEN. All pupils including pupils with SEN will have access to a broad, balanced and relevant curriculum including the National Curriculum, delivered through a variety of teaching methods. A stimulating learning environment is provided for children to develop self-esteem, self-confidence, independence and the basic skills of Literacy, Numeracy and ICT.

The named governor for ALN is Mr Williams. The Additional Learning Needs Coordinator (ALNCo) is Mrs M Dunn.

Mrs Dunn coordinates and leads the work of our LA funded Learning Resource Base staff, our Intervention Group staff and one-to-one staff. She also supports all the teachers and teaching assistants who teach our pupils.

The success of the school's policy is reflected in the inclusion of pupils with ALN in the academic, cultural and social life of the school and is demonstrated by effective means of identification, assessment and provision as stated in the school's ALN Policy.

The school liaised with various outside agencies, such as Gwent Health, Social Services and voluntary organisations, regarding pupils with ALN. Links with other schools have involved visits from teachers at Bassaleg School to prepare pupils for transfer to year7.
