WHO ARE THE GWENT REGIONAL PARTNERSHIP BOARD?



The Gwent Regional Partnership Board (RPB) brings together local authorities, health services and third sector partners to improve health, social care and wellbeing across Gwent. Established under the Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act, the RPB works to ensure people have more choice and control, receive person-centred support, and benefit from better-coordinated services that make effective use of resources.

WHAT IS THE POPULATION NEEDS ASSESSMENT?

Every five years, the Population Needs Assessment helps identify the health, social care and wellbeing needs of people living in Gwent including Torfaen, Newport, Caerphilly, Monmouthshire and Blaenau Gwent. The assessment guides the planning of services that range from everyday practical support and staying safe at home, to emotional wellbeing, specialist advice and help for carers.

The RPB now wants to hear from people across Gwent about what matters most to them when it comes to accessing care and support, how they think services should work, and how they see their role in maintaining their own health and wellbeing. Understanding people's experiences and the relationship they have with the services they use, will help make it easier for everyone to know what support is available and how to access it at the right time. By working together, we can develop better, more responsive joined up health and social care services where individuals feel heard, valued and actively involved in shaping their own care.

PWY YW BWRDD PARTNERIAETH RHANBARTHOL GWENT?



Mae Bwrdd Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol Gwent (RPB) yn dod â awdurdodau lleol, gwasanaethau iechyd a phartneriaid trydydd sector at ei gilydd i wella iechyd, gofal cymdeithasol a lles yn ardal Gwent.
